

Federal programs across the NIH and CDC are essential to Illinois's fight against diabetes. Cuts threaten the research, prevention, and infrastructure supporting the 1.2M adults in Illinois living with diabetes.<sup>1</sup>

## NIDDK | National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive & Kidney Diseases

**Current Funding: \$28.9M**

- The NIDDK currently funds **59 projects** across Illinois, with **\$13M** committed to diabetes-related research in 2024 alone.<sup>1,2</sup>
- The NIDDK supports **19 active clinical trials** in the state.<sup>3</sup>
- Cuts would threaten this nationwide research engine that advances care and improves health outcomes for over 1M adults in Illinois.

## DNPAO | CDC Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity

**FY 2024 Funding: \$888,000**

- Cuts would threaten **\$888,000** in direct funding to the Illinois Public Health Institute for the State Physical Activity and Nutrition (SPAN) Program.<sup>4</sup>
- Furthermore, DNPAO supports essential tools and programs used across the state. Cooperative agreements power statewide efforts to strengthen obesity prevention, enhance early childhood nutrition, expand provider training, and promote healthy communities.<sup>5</sup>

## National DPP | CDC National Diabetes Prevention Program

**FY 2023 Funding: \$2.5M<sup>6</sup>**

- National DPP supports diabetes prevention programs for **nearly 13,000 enrollees** offered by **62 organizations** across **24 cities**.<sup>7,8</sup>
- Cuts would disrupt access to evidence-based lifestyle interventions shown to reduce the risk of type 2 diabetes by **58%** in adults and **71%** among seniors.<sup>9</sup>

## DDT | CDC Division of Diabetes Translation

**Current Funding: \$8M**

- Cuts would threaten **over \$8M** that supports the Illinois Department of Public Health in tracking, preventing, and managing diabetes.<sup>7</sup>
