## **Fund Diabetes Programs.**

Federal programs across the NIH and CDC are essential to Colorado's fight against diabetes. Cuts threaten the research, prevention, and infrastructure supporting the 377,300 adults in Colorado living with diabetes.1

**National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive & Kidney Diseases** NIDDK | National Institute of Pieze
Current Funding: \$17.5M

- The NIDDK currently funds 51 projects across Colorado, with \$5.4M committed to diabetesrelated research in 2024 alone.1
- The NIDDK supports 21 active clinical trials.<sup>3</sup>
- Cuts would threaten this nationwide research engine that advances care and improves health outcomes for over 350,000 Coloradans.

**CDC Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity** FY 2024 Funding: \$1.8M

- Cuts would disrupt \$1.8M in statewide efforts to reduce the risk of chronic conditions through nutrition access, physical activity infrastructure, and obesity prevention:
  - \$880,000 to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment for the State Physical Activity and Nutrition (SPAN) Program.
  - \$902,261 to the Stapleton Foundation for Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) Programs.⁴

### **Expanding Nutrition Access**

through nutrition guidelines within hospitals, food banks, worksites, and after-school programs.

#### **Promoting Early Health**

with farm-to-child care programs, provider education, and breastfeeding support.

#### **Encouraging Active Lifestyles**

by promoting urban design work that aligns with active communities.5

## **National DPP**

**CDC National Diabetes Prevention Program** 

FY 2023 Funding: \$850,000°

- National DPP supports diabetes prevention programs for over 25,000 enrollees offered by 26 organizations across 20 cities.<sup>7,8</sup>
- Cuts would disrupt access to evidence-based lifestyle interventions shown to reduce the risk of type 2 diabetes by 58% in adults and 71% among seniors.9
