

Federal programs across the NIH and CDC are essential to Colorado's fight against diabetes. Cuts threaten the research, prevention, and infrastructure supporting the 377,300 adults in Colorado living with diabetes.¹

NIDDK | National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive & Kidney Diseases Current Funding: **\$17.5M**

- The NIDDK currently funds **51 projects** across Colorado, with **\$5.4M** committed to diabetes-related research in 2024 alone.^{1,2}
- The NIDDK supports **21 active clinical trials**.³
- Cuts would threaten this nationwide research engine that advances care and improves health outcomes for over 350,000 Coloradans.

DNPAO | CDC Division of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity FY 2024 Funding: **\$1.8M**

- Cuts would disrupt \$1.8M in statewide efforts to reduce the risk of chronic conditions through nutrition access, physical activity infrastructure, and obesity prevention:
 - **\$880,000** to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment for the State Physical Activity and Nutrition (SPAN) Program.
 - **\$902,261** to the Stapleton Foundation for Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) Programs.⁴

Expanding Nutrition Access

through nutrition guidelines within hospitals, food banks, worksites, and after-school programs.

Promoting Early Health

with farm-to-child care programs, provider education, and breastfeeding support.

Encouraging Active Lifestyles

by promoting urban design work that aligns with active communities.⁵

National DPP | CDC National Diabetes Prevention Program FY 2023 Funding: **\$850,000**⁶

- National DPP supports diabetes prevention programs for **over 25,000 enrollees** offered by **26 organizations** across **20 cities**.^{7,8}
- Cuts would disrupt access to evidence-based lifestyle interventions shown to reduce the risk of type 2 diabetes by **58%** in adults and **71%** among seniors.⁹

DDT | CDC Division of Diabetes Translation Current Funding: **\$1.2M**

- Cuts would threaten **over \$1M** that supports the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment in tracking, preventing, and managing diabetes.⁷
