Every year, more than 18,000 children are diagnosed with type 1 diabetes, and an estimated 304,000 are currently living with diabetes in the United States. These children and their families must navigate daily challenges and evaluate every bite they eat, every physical activity they undertake, and every symptom they experience—often leading to feelings of isolation and stress. Camp offers a much-needed reprieve for both children and their families.

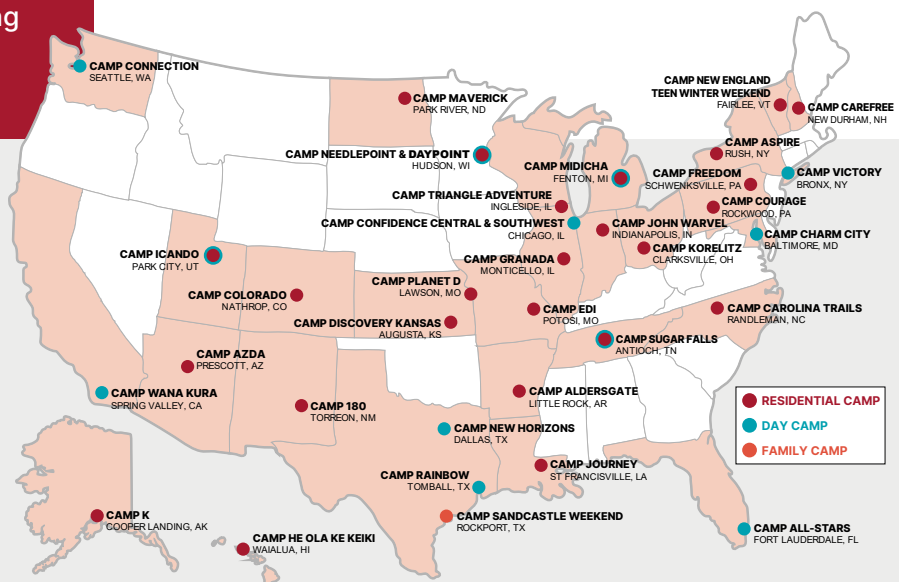
## ENSURING SAFETY AND EXCELLENCE

At ADA Camp, safety is our top priority. Our dedicated camp team provides round-the-clock care, giving families peace of mind, while their children experience the magic of camp.

- **Care and Support:** Our medical professionals perform under the guidance of a licensed medical director. Teams vary by camp and may include doctors, medical residents, pharmacists, psychologists, nurses, dietitians, social workers, EMTs, and other specialists.
- **Volunteer Training:** All volunteers, both medical and non-medical, undergo extensive training to stay up to date on diabetes management and treatment practices.

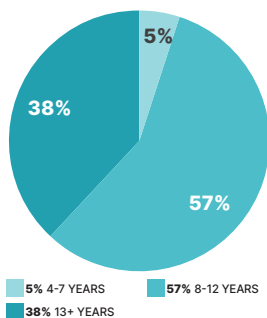

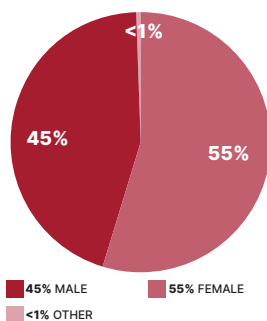
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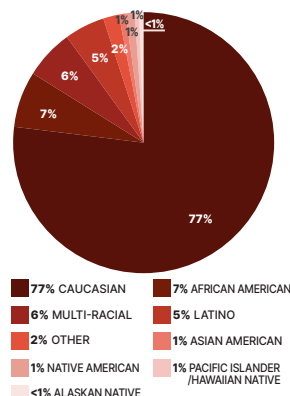
TIME WITH DIABETES
